Area Happenings

Novena for the Assumption of Mary

The Basilica and National Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation, Carey, Ohio welcomes everyone to join them August 6-14 for the annual novena to Our Lady of Consolation in preparation for the feast of her Assumption. The annual celebration of Mary's Assumption into heaven is the largest event at the Shrine. This year's Novena preacher will be Fr. David J. Endres. Fr. David is a priest of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, ordained in 2009. He is the academic dean and associate professor of church history and historical theology at Mount St. Mary's Seminary/Athenaeum of Ohio in Cincinnati. In addition to teaching, he is a weekend assistant at St. Thomas More Church, Withamsville, Ohio. He holds a doctoral degree from the School of Theology at The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C. He is editor of the scholarly quarterly, *U.S. Catholic Historian* and contributes a monthly column in Cincinnati's *Catholic Telegraph* and the national magazine, *Catholic Digest*. Fr. David's article "What Medicine Could Not Cure: Faith Healings at the Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation" appeared in the summer 2016 issue, *US Catholic Historian*. He has also just recently published a book on Franciscan parish life in the U.S. in which he discusses the early years of the Shrine and the devotion to Our Lady of Consolation in Chapter 3. The title is **Many Tongues, One Faith: A History of Franciscan Parish Life in the United States.**

Dear Padre

July 22, 2018

My daughter will make her first confession soon. She seems too young to have sinned in any serious way. What is the point of making a child anxious about such things?

Confession, or the sacrament of penance, is not meant to make anyone anxious. In fact, its purpose is just the opposite.

This sacrament provides us the opportunity to reflect on our failures toward God and other people, to express sorrow for those failures, and to be assured of God's forgiveness for them. We shouldn't be too hasty in assuming that young children are unaware of wrongdoing and the need to say, "I'm sorry." Even very young children can be deliberately mean, cruel, or selfish.

Before children experience the sacrament of reconciliation for the first time, they should be able to distinguish between deliberate and accidental actions. (Breaking a plate may be an accident; breaking it over your brother's head is probably deliberate.) They should also be able to express their faults in their own words, and they should have some understanding that their sins affect their relationship with God, who loves them unconditionally but is hurt by their wrong decisions and actions.

In general, children are able to fulfill these conditions between the ages of seven and eight. If a child's moral awareness develops more slowly, parents can request that the reception of the sacrament be postponed.
