**Bishop Daniel E. Thomas Leads Ecumenical Prayer Vigil and Procession**

Join Bishop Daniel E. Thomas Saturday, Nov. 17, 2018 for an ecumenical **Prayer Vigil for Life** from 10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., at St. Francis De Sales Chapel, 501 Cherry Street, Toledo. Following the Prayer Vigil, Bishop Thomas will lead a **Procession to ProMedica Headquarters**, 100 Madison Avenue in Toledo. The prayer vigil is being held to peacefully protest the transfer agreement ProMedica signed in February, 2018, with Capital Care Network, Toledo's only abortion facility. Over 13,000 signatures support asking ProMedica's President/CEO Randy Oostra and the ProMedica Board of Directors to reconsider this transfer agreement. You may sign the petition at [www.petition.life](http://www.petition.life) which states: "I believe a prestigious healthcare provider like ProMedica should not support an abortion facility that *ENDS* life rather than *SUSTAINS* it."

### Consecration to Mary



#### St. Louis de Montfort's Way: Total Consecration

*Through this 33-day program you are giving Mary all of yourself - heart, mind, and soul - in order to bring you to her Son, Jesus Christ. Also that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan - i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (as she assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues) and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God. There are 5 Steps in the process are:*

**Step 1** - Read "True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary": This is located on the website or you can purchase your own copy.

**Step 2** - Choose a day for the Consecration: This step is completed. As a parish we will make our consecration on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

**Step 3** - 33 Days of Prayer and readings: These prayers start on November 4 so that we finish in time for the day of consecration. These prayers are also located on the website.

**Step 4** - Consecration Day: This will be on December 7.

**Step 5** - After Consecration: Once you have consecrated yourself to Jesus through Mary, live that consecration. These recommendations are also located on the website.

# Dear Padre

November 11, 2018

***Is envy a sin? I find myself becoming very envious of people who have more than I do. I find it difficult to be content with what my family and I have now.***

We live in a climate of want that encourages discontent with what we have. Advertising plays on our feelings of envy and our desire for possessions. In this almost universal rush to possess more and better material objects, Christians are called to a counter witness. We are called to embrace a freedom and a poverty of spirit that actually rejoices in the blessings of others.

The Tenth Commandment alerts us to the danger of undisciplined envy: "You shall not covet...anything that belongs to your neighbor" (Exodus 20:17). In the New Testament, Jesus says that where our treasure is, there also will be our heart (Matthew 6:21). The real antidote to envy, then, is prayers of thanksgiving for all God has given to us and others.

To feel envious, to desire or covet someone else's possessions, is not in itself a mortal sin. But to let that feeling invade your mind, to indulge it and brood over it, to set your heart on it, is to let that feeling harden into an envious frame of mind. Then you are flirting with real sin. The grave sin is to allow these envious thoughts to drive you to any injustice or evil.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* sums it up well: "Would you like to see God glorified by you? Then rejoice in your brother's [and sister's] progress and you will immediately give glory to God" (CCC 2540).
