Consecration to Mary



St. Louis de Montfort's Way: Total Consecration

Through this 33-day program you are giving Mary all of yourself - heart, mind, and soul - in order to bring you to her Son, Jesus Christ. Also that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan - i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (as she assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues) and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God. There are 5 Steps in the process are:

- **Step 1** Read "True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary": This is located on the website or you can purchase your own copy.
- **Step 2** Choose a day for the Consecration: This step is completed. As a parish we will make our consecration on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.
- **Step 3** 33 Days of Prayer and readings: These prayers start on November 4 so that we finish in time for the day of consecration. These prayers are also located on the website.
- **Step 4** Consecration Day: This will be on December 7.
- **Step 5** After Consecration: Once you have consecrated yourself to Jesus through Mary, live that consecration. These recommendations are also located on the website.

Can you clarify the role of nuns and women in the Church? When I was growing up, they seemed much more involved, but nowadays our church never seems to discuss their role or support their work.

Women's role in the Church is essential in many areas, including teaching, passing on the faith to their families, and witnessing to their faith in the community. Religious sisters are essential to the Church's pastoral care, as Vatican II states: "From the outset of the work of evangelization, the missionary 'planting' and expansion of the Church require the presence of the religious life in all its forms" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 927).

Religious sisters, and their religious brothers, share a universal call to be "devoted to the welfare of the whole Church... working to implant and strengthen the Kingdom of Christ" in a new generation of Catholics (Dogmatic Constitution on the Church [Lumen Gentium], 44).

Today, sisters have declined in number, but they are present and essential to Church ministry through religious education, pastoral care in hospitals, faith-based social outreach, and parish and diocesan administration. They continue Christ's presence, as did the women first to encounter the risen Christ and bring this Good News to others.

We need religious sisters; parents and parishes need to speak about vocations. God gives the gift, and we have the responsibility to nurture those women "called to signify the very charity of God in the language of our time" (CCC 926).
