Spiritual Adoption Program

WE INVITE ALL PARISHIONERS AND THOSE WHO ARE VISITING, TO JOIN US. WE WILL BEGIN AS A PARISH ON JANUARY 26, 2020. (PRAY CARDS WILL BE GIVEN OUT AT THAT TIME)

With assaults on human life increasing at an alarming rate, today we can make a personal commitment to pray daily for one unborn child who is in

danger of being aborted. Unfortunately, the number of abortions has increased to 1.4 million annually since the Roe vs. Wade decision in 1973. Each of us is being asked to "spiritually adopt" one unknown baby for the next nine months. We will pray for this child that he or she will be carried to term and experience the fullness of life, as God intended.

For just a moment, picture a young woman who just this week discovered that she is seven weeks pregnant. What she may not know is that her baby's heart has been beating for four weeks, it can flex its fingers and toes, suck on his or her thumb and is totally dependent on her. She may not know where to turn. She is considering aborting this baby. She may be under pressure from others and think there is no other option. But many people, like us, do care enough to help her and her baby. All our prayers can make a difference between whether this baby will be born - or aborted. Our prayers can also be a form of spiritual support for both of the baby's parents.

Please take a prayer card placed on the table next week in the back of church and pray the ten-second prayer daily for your "adopted child". You are also encouraged to name your baby and give him or her an identity. Of course this child's real identity is unknown to everyone except God Who knew each of us even before we were conceived *Psalms 139:15-16*. At the end of the nine-month period we will celebrate the "birth" of our spiritually adopted babies with a baby shower. In this way we can also help, in a very tangible way, the mother as she brings to term a beautiful gift of life.

 Feel free to wear a pink or blue ribbon around your wrist or pinned to your shirt to help you remember the daily prayer.

This Wednesday, January 22, the Church in the United States observes the annual "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." This day is set aside to pray for the legal protection of human life and to do penance for the violations to human dignity through abortion. We are called to observe this day through prayer and penance.

A religious community invited me to become a lay associate. What kind of commitment is needed?

When laypeople and ordained ministers are attracted to the charism of a religious order (its distinctive ministry, mission, and spirituality), they're often invited by its vowed members to participate as "associates" in their prayer life, community dynamics, and apostolic works. After a period of formation, associates may make degrees of commitment, with varying expectations on those who profess a formal commitment. Associates may also be given a distinctive sign of their membership to wear during prayer and ministry.

While associates like the Third Order (tertiaries) have partnered with Franciscans, Dominicans, and Carmelites for centuries, other congregations are only now nurturing new forms of collaboration. Usually, this partnership is mutually transformative for the associates and for those in consecrated life: "The participation of the laity often brings unexpected and rich insights into certain aspects of the charism, leading to a more spiritual interpretation of it and helping to draw from it directions for new activities in the apostolate" (Apostolic Exhortation on Consecrated Life [Vita Consecrata], 55).

Partnerships between religious communities and their associates are growing in number, based not on utility or diminished numbers of religious today, but on shared faith and responsibility to our universal baptismal call. May the Holy Spirit guide you as you discern this special invitation to holiness!
