The 13th annual *March for Life* will be held January 22 at noon at the Defiance County Courthouse. The march is sponsored by Mother Teresa Respect for Life. The purpose of the March for Life is for participants to walk and stand up for unborn children who cannot speak for themselves. The march will start with prayer with Father Stanbery. A police escort will lead participants from the Defiance County Courthouse to the Monument of the Unborn at St. John Catholic Church. Jamie Blank will host the march and lead a prayer for life at the monument. From there, the event moves to the basement of St. John Church where Colleen Hammons whose parents are the late Dale and Madonna Hammons will talk on modern day miracles that are changing peoples attitude on their lives. Mary Juarez will talk who is a Mom Grandmom and author and founder of Never Let Go Ministries. Mary will be speaking of being adopted by a beautiful family and how she wanted to meet her birth Mom. Wayne Staszal who is a chimney sweep will speak about the feelings as the father of an aborted baby and how it affected him and haunted him over the years. Culture for Life is a group of young people set out to restore culture through the experience of virtue. They will speak on the dignity of the human person inviting our culture to become alive. Ed Sitter RTLACO president will give some pro life remarks. "He's got the Whole World in His Hands" and "God Bless America" will be sung by Jim Zipfel. The event will close with prayer. Masks are asked to be worn with distancing. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be celebrated by Father Doug Taylor of St. John Catholic Church, Defiance, at 9:00 am. Throughout the day there will be exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament ending with Benediction with Deacon Mark Homier at 4:45 pm.

My fiancée was baptized in the Lutheran Church. If she becomes Catholic, will she be baptized again?

A person can be validly baptized only once, whether in or out of the Catholic Church. Catholics believe three things are necessary for a valid baptism: baptizing in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; flowing water; and the intention of the "minister" to baptize using the form (words of the Trinitarian formula) and matter (flowing water) needed for a valid baptism.

Orthodox and most Protestant baptisms are recognized by the Catholic Church. However, the Catholic Church does not recognize as valid baptisms performed by Christian communities that don't believe in the Trinity—Jehovah's Witnesses and Mormons, for example. These communities may use the same matter (flowing water), but they don't have the same form (Trinitarian formula) or intention in their baptism.

If your fiancée decides to become Catholic, she will need to attend Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults sessions, make her first Communion and reconciliation, and be confirmed, but she has already been validly baptized and will not need to be baptized again.
